Here are LARRY's TIPS for this month- Larry showed us how to get people on the layout - straight pins into figures and then stick people onto the layout, works better than the "sticky" glue that can leave a residue. 
Great Northern Railway, 1955, between Skykomish and Wenatchee, Washington, over Stevens Pass. The layout is about 800 sq. ft., with point to point operation with a provision for continuous running for open houses. All track work is completed, scenery is 85% complete, including scenes that vary from desert to high mountain winter, including 108 ft. of hand painted backdrop. Most structures are scratch built. The layout operates steam, diesel and heavy electrics under catenary. Control is with Digitrax DCC.

N Standard Gauge

The DH&N Railroad (Danforth Hadley & Northern) is a Proto-Freelance, loosely based on the Northern Pacific Railway in Central Montana, from Huntley to Garrison in 1952. It includes NP and GN interchanges and traffic. It is 38' X 52', services 10 towns using NCE DCC. Track is code 55 and all turnouts are handmade
