LARRY's TIPS for this month wereHe was building auto frames for a
load, hard to glue together, made
assembly jig from light scrap wood
that holds in place for gluing.
Used tweezers with angled head to

was about paint- add 3 BB's to
every paint jar to keep paint
fluid and as a check - shake can,
hear BB's? paint still good!
Breaking in an engine - check
directions from manufacturer.

#### **BILL'S TOOL TIME**

Div 6 member Bill Deeter presents different tools and ideas. This month Bill showed how to use butter lids on tape rolls to keep edges safe and clean. They also good paint pallets. Bill found a good wire stripper made in USA looks like pliers. Next was a small wood roller to help tape adhere to surfaces. Bill also showed a paint kit from Harbor freight, good deal and had many pieces including a plastic roller like the wood one just mentioned. Plastic scrapers for fiberglass work or plaster - can make into any shape for many uses. Last item shown was a heat gun helps to bend styrene and shrink tubing items. Run on cool setting to cool down after use.

A modeling TIP by Barry was that Flags for denoting where sewer and electrical lines are buried in ground - most/many are made of styrene rod - take flags when work is DONE, cut flag off and you have free styrene rod!!

There was a question from Marty on how to unglue parts? One suggestion was to apply more glue, that will then soften the old glue and you could then pull parts apart. There is also a UNbonding agent made mostly for ACC. Looking forward to another tool tip next month. THANKS Bill!

I'm sorry that I could not type in your whole story, but I hope I hit the highlights of your story. The stories are-

Jim Z- Copper Valley RR HO - 3<sup>rd</sup> version, what if- copper country in Michigan that continued to operate instead of being abandoned. Name came about due to wife's police duties and where police lived in Detroit. "COP-per country"

Dick H- C&NW, liked color scheme and northern Michigan - proto-freelanced.

Marty- BN-SD , named for MI State, liked green diesels with white face; wife from Nebraska so it all fits, running modern era - did not merge with SF

Tom K- 1970's Burlington - just starting layout CBQ- liked black scheme

Dave J- photographer first, modeler second- has models of all favorite MI railroads

Russ - history buff; modeling
Northern Pacific; liked paint
scheme

Eric - fictious RR; Harbor & Grosse Point RR named after dad's home towns

Jim F- modeling the New York Central very early 60's, Greenfield road east.

Bob McK- Monon RR, saw as kid; lost river RR named after land owned in town Jim G- American flyer, some HO and O; modeling 1946-67.

Joe K- HO and N PRR items, no layout at present;

Roy J- models C&O/pere Marquette, started in 1976, John Armstrong layout from book;

Joe Bliss- started 1976, Allegany Central- based on C&O; freelanced in steam era, layout still going strong

Doug M - no layout at present, plans to be fictional layout in Michigan east to west pt-to-pt,

Bill McM- CN early scheme in green, Father electrical contractor that did work for CN and Bill went with dad to yard/shop areas, modeling in G

Dave K- models PRR in O scale, started in hobby in '49; was based in Lionel, but migrated to scale Built present layout in 1.5 years!

Connie- ho scale based in northern Maine, will be a military based layout and B&M,

Walt- PRR in HO scale, based on layout in MR that is heavy on industry, went to NC to see actual layout, adjusted plan to fit room. Started in 2005 and with RG help, up and running.

Bill D- working with son-in-law and grandson, layout at their house, 4R Robert Reading Rail Road; mostly based for coal hauling and includes big coal dock & freighter + regular switching

Barry- started with Lionel and Christmas trains, got own HO about 10 years old, brother gave me GP20's in Reading - liked paint scheme, green favorite color - got back into hobby and friend enticed me to do research and model the Reading - the rest is history....

Jim T- PRR in HO scale, mid 50's plus B&O - 2 layouts in one that interchange; Proto-freelanced, in 1998 got back into hobby started layout in 2001;

Norm- models Michigan Southern, 3<sup>rd</sup> layout, met Bruce Caddy in school where both teached, and went to OPS session. Designed layout to be from Michigan south to Louisville - thus "MI Southern"

Don B- fell in love with the Southern Pacific, colors and all types of steam, HO scale layout in progress as part of the RG,

Doug M- Lionel to HO as child; found book in Joe's Hobby store-all about C&O steam, that set what to model, modeling New River Gorge in HO

Hank M- likes gear driven loco's, so has branched off of Doug's C&O with logging line Mike S- free lanced copper country layout, parents raised in mine areas,

Dan K- narrow gauge in S scale, interested from grand-fathers Lionel set. Working on layout for past 15 years

John W- born/raised in Pittsburgh, near interurban lines, but interested in steam-coal, book on trolley modeling formed basis of interest and now modeling, but did keep some steam too. RR named shared with famous editor, but was had at same time.

Irwin- never had Lionel, but got HO train as 10 yr old - Fleishman brand. Lived in Pittsburgh area and grew up with PRR, but found N&W! found Keystone WV, real place the N&W went through, became RR name, Keystone Valley. Modeling HO

Matt L- (new guy) no layout at present, planned, lived in Kansas, was/is SF fan, and others in area John B- started with Am Flyer!


Interested in 1900 time period, collected much equipment - Oakridge & Western - short line freelanced HO scale to be built based on DL&W
