PRODUCT REVIEW

We did have a product review this month, done by Dave Jakubiac. Dave gave a review of a video bought from Greg Neff video at a local train show. TOOL TIME

Div 6 member Bill Deeter gives us a look at some interesting and useful tools - This month it was a drill set costing \$60-70. The Forstner drill bits, used for making holes, but unlike cheap hole drills, they do not cut a "disk" to make the hole. They are full blade drills, so they clean-up/out the hole. This is really good if it is not a through hole. They can also be used on angles! They are made in sizes from .25" to 2.125" Also Brad point drills, work the same, are smaller sizes and keep you centered.

SHOW AND TELL

The subject for the last meeting was off line structures, which is any structure NOT serviced or owned by the railroad. Items shown werecompany housing house, DPM taxi co, saw mill display, gold mine, AHM farm house, warehouse, billboard, workshop, power house & electric yard substation, general store, church with interior, fire station (from 1960 MR article), company house, bar/inn DPM kit, industry bldgs Sn3, 4 company houses assembled differently, farm house, fishing shack, dentist office kitbash, fire house, military storage bunkers, Quonset hut, ash pit conveyor, Billboard, out house, Bar Mills Wicked Wanda's, N scale bakery, town stores, kitbash covered highway bridge, house, wood store kit.

Current projects included- taking part of the layout apart to fix wall leak, water column, O scale steam engine, girder bridge, boxes to hold radios placed around layout - like phones, PRR work train cars, O scale mill gon. We did have some members donate to the caboose. Thanks to those that did.

WHO WE ARE

We are Division 6 of the North Central Region (NCR) of the National Model Railroad Association (NMRA). What that means is, the NMRA is the model railroad association for the country (and even world). The country is divided into REGIONS, which are one or more states. Our Region, the North Central Region (NCR), is all of Michigan and the northern part of Ohio and Indiana. Each Region is then divided into DIVISIONS, which are one or more counties. Division 6 is primarily Wayne County, but we have many members from western Oakland County and we aren't strict on membership and boundaries. All total, there are about 8 Divisions in our Region.

RAILROAD HISTORY

Norm was not present to do a History lesson this past month. Looking forward to another lesson next month.

CLINIC

This months clinic was by Brook Qualaman on scratch structure building. And Brook knows what she is talking about, having received 3 merit awards!! The clinic showed how Brook researched and built HO scale versions of several family homes. Use google maps to look up structures - they have street level pictures and can rotate and see all sides - great for doing models of a structure clear across the country! Tools used - scale ruler, xacto knife, Tenx and model master glue, cutting pad, box cutter for "big" cuts, and used parts from different scales to make parts needed. Using Sanborn maps from library to see how buildings were laid out and dimensions of structures. Also use old family photos for house pictures!

How to build- draw simple outline of house, sketch walls of house, write part numbers (windows/doors, etc) on sketches, build cardboard mock-up, number wall sections to keep track of where they go, use lots of bracing to keep models square and straight, paint parts separately, dull coat windows on the inside to keep outside shiny! Another great souce for pictures of long gone structures are Acadia or Postcard books.

I believe this is the first time we've had a clinic by a member's wife (or any woman) and it was great!! Congradulations Brook on a great clinic, full of good info!! Thanks! If you are willing to do a clinic, please, e-mail or call or see Howard at the meetings and share your thoughts.

MODELING INFO W/LARRY

Here are LARRY's TIPS for this month- Larry showed a McD coffee stir stick- for signs and sign posts; use hair clips modified for clamps, twigs for cut wood, use alum foil cut-off strip from box cut to make logging cross-cut saw!; T pin taped to block of small wood to use to position figures in tight spaces; split twigs with xacto blade and small hammer - like splitting real wood for details; wax paper on sheet of balsa wood to act as a movable work surface Thanks Larry for some great info! OTHER TIPS-

Doug Meyer has idea for free foam - go to trailer sales company - trailers are stacked with BLOCKs of white Styrofoam and they will give them to you for free, as they are scrap to the sales dealer!! Approx size 12x12x24 and SOLID!




DIV 6 MISC NEWS
